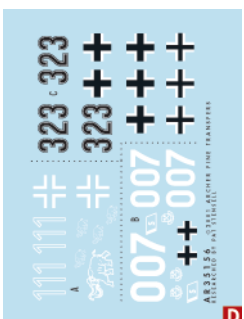

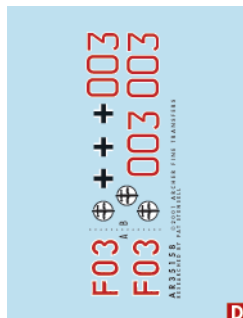

Markings depict a tank with all the early features (lowered lights, rear hull spare tracks and early exhaust covers) that transitioned to the 10th PzDiv with these features in tact and new coat of Olive drab paint.

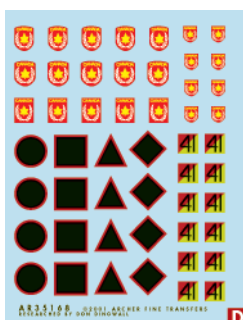

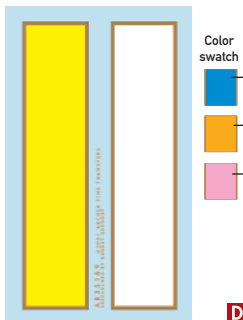
